PRESIDENT AND EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

From Donna Scott, President and Glenn Lethbridge, Executive Director

Ontario Sailing has seen many great things happen in 2008! Below is a quick summary of some of the highlights of the year.

- **The creation of three Ontario Sailing Training Centres and ten Ontario Sailing Development Centres**
 - The purpose of these centres is to provide high performance training for OST and OSDT athletes and other athletes training at these centres. Ontario Sailing has supported these centres with funding towards coaching support. An Ontario Sailing High Performance Coordinator was hired this year to work with the coaches at the various centres, set up Training Camps at the centres and work to bring in quality boat specific and other professional coaches to the centres. To see the list of the various Training Centres please look under Racing at www.ontariosailing.ca.
- **Continuation of the Ontario Sailing BOOM Mobile Sailing Program**
 - In 2008 the BOOM program operated 5 mobiles, including the Access team, went to 31 sites across Ontario, traveling 60,000 km and went as far as Nova Scotia. The BOOM Mobile Sailing Program brings boats and instructors to communities and small yacht/sailing clubs that do not have their own sailing school. A total of 700 students were taught this year.
- **Race-Management Assistance and Development**
 - Ontario Sailing helped several clubs find Race Officers for races this year. As well, an On-Water Race Management Seminar was conducted for the Outer Harbour Federation. In addition, the Ontario Sailing Race Management Committee ran training courses for both Race Officers and Mark Setting.
- **Learn To Sail Symposium Extension**
 - During the spring Executive Director, Glenn Lethbridge, brought the 2007 Ontario Sailing Learn To Sail Symposium to 13 clubs in the Ottawa region. The 2008 Symposium occurred on November 8 & 9, 2008 at the Port Credit Yacht Club.
- **CYA Instructor Certification**
 - For the first time this year, there were 2 Program Manager modules run to assist individuals to become competent administrators of a sailing school program.
 - In 2008 Ontario Sailing ran the following clinics for sailing instructors: 8 Green clinics, 4 Blue clinics, 1 Windsurfing clinic, 1 Orange Race Coach clinic, 3 Basic Cruising clinics, 1 Intermediate Cruising clinic, 1 Learn To Race Coach clinic, 1 Power Cross-Over clinic, 1 CYA Fundamentals course, as well as various courses to cover pre-requisites needed to be an instructor.
 - A total of 245 instructors participated in our instructor clinics as well as 126 participants in our Pre-requisite clinics.
- **Club Manager Forum**
 - Ontario Sailing coordinates quarterly meetings of club managers in the Golden Horseshoe that have paid, full-time, professional staff. Highlights covered in this past years meetings include topics such as club insurance, food and beverage, staffing, water levels and working with boards.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Following a three-year period of financial ups and downs, Ontario Sailing recorded a surplus of \$13,274 for the fiscal year ended March 31, 2008. Revenues in 2007-08 of \$918K were \$30K greater than the prior year, and expenditures of \$905K went down modestly. Cash and short-term investments at the beginning of April 2008 remained stable as compared to last year (about \$167K) and a slight decrease in short-term payables indicated a sound basis for meeting next year's operating requirements. Finally, Ontario Sailing again received a clean audit opinion on the financial statements prepared by management and staff, as presented in this annual report.

The positive financial performance in 2007-08 was due to several factors: increased participation revenue in novice athlete development programs, such as BOOM; improved capacity to keep expenditures in control while delivering valuable sailing and boating programs and services to Ontario Sailing members; a successful fundraising program; strong financial planning and budgeting practices; and importantly, a better understanding and application of base funding requirements from the Ontario Ministry of Health Promotion which currently represents about one-third of Ontario Sailing's revenue (including ACTIVE2010 and Quest For Gold programs). Looking forward, your Board of Directors and staff will closely monitor changes anticipated in the government funding cycle to determine their impact on the financial performance of Ontario Sailing.

FUNDRAISING REPORT

The annual operation of Ontario Sailing relies on a number of levels of external funding which are:

- Government
- Corporate
- Individual
- Event based

The Fundraising Committee's goal is to raise funds through corporate sponsorships, individual donations and targeted fundraising events.

Some of our corporate sponsorship support is received in the form of monetary support, some in the form of gifts-in-kind, some in the form of services provided and some a combination of more than one of the above. APPEALS COMMITTEE REPORT

From Andrew Alberti, Committee Chair

The Ontario Sailing Appeals Committee's job is to answer appeals submitted by competitors who have been party to a protest hearing and are unsatisfied with the decision of the Protest Committee. Appeals can only be submitted by parties to the protest hearing and usually claim there was an incorrect rule interpretation or conclusion, or a procedural mistake by the Protest Committee. Some appeals attempt to appeal the facts found which, according to *The Racing Rules of Sailing*, may not be appealed. The Appeals Committee also responds to requests from protest committees for confirmation or correction of its decision when it is uncertain it came to the correct decision.

In 2007 the procedures to deliver an appeal were changed slightly when the CYA changed their prescription to *The Racing Rules of Sailing* at the request of the ISAF. Appeals are now sent to the CYA and then delegated to the provincial association if appropriate, rather than the previous procedure of appealing directly to the provincial association. This year the CYA office had some challenges and this process was very slow.

In 2008 the Ontario Sailing Appeals Committee dealt with five appeals, down from six in 2007. Due to the delays mentioned above, several are still in process as we write this report. So far, no appeals have been further appealed to the CYA Appeals Committee.

This year none of the appeals involved protests where a member of our committee was a member of the original protest committee. *The Racing Rules of Sailing* prohibits the involvement of such a member in any appeal. We continue to keep the numbers and depth on the committee to handle the appeal without the involvement of any particular member.

We continued our practice from last year of handling as much of the appeal process as possible electronically. To make sure that the parties receive the final decision, a hardcopy is sent via regular mail as well. I want to take this opportunity to thank Shauna Cartlidge for stepping back into the role she performed a few years ago and for all of her efforts processing the appeals for us.

We invited a new member to join the committee this year. Janet McDougall, a Senior Canadian Judge and National Umpire with a real strength as a student of the rules, joined the committee to replace a member who had stepped down in 2007.

We have an excellent group of experienced judges on the Ontario Sailing Appeals Committee and great Ontario Sailing staff and I thank them all on your behalf. The members of the committee are:

BOOM PROGRAM REPORT From Eric Cartlidge, Program Director

2008 was even better than 2007 and another record setting year for the BOOM Program. This year 700 people participated in a BOOM Mobile, which is more than ever before. Ontario Sailing operated 5 mobiles this summer, 3 that offered BOOM, one that offered Access BOOM and one that offered our Instructor only mobile. With our 5 mobiles we visited 31 different sites for 1 or 2 weeks at a time.

Mobiles – The BOOM program this year visited a record number of sites and trained a record number of people. This shows that the demand for the program remains high and along with this record number of hosts we still had a few on the waiting list. There were once again programs that offered a variety of programming options to the BOOM participants. Some offered full day programming while others offered half day programming, 1 or 2 weeks in length.

Of the 31 sites visited, 3 of them had never hosted the BOOM program before and 28 were repeat customers, showing that the program is still growing and reaching across the province and at the same time leaving a lasting impression for repeat clientele.

The 2008 registration process saw the BOOM Program sell out by the beginning of December and the Access BOOM by the end of February, once again reiterating the demand for the program.

Equipment – We operate the BOOM program with 24 Laser Pico dinghies, 4 Access 2.3 dinghies, 5 coach boats 5 trailers and 5 rental vans.

ABLE SAIL REPORT

From Eric Cartlidge, Program Director & Keith Hobbs, Committee Chair

Ontario Sailing has several initiatives to increase the level of accessible sailing in Ontario. Through our programs, and use of special equipment, people of all ages and with all types of disabilities can experience the joy of sailing.



Able Sail Ontario

The Clubs that offer Able Sail programs across the province and Ontario Sailing have formed a provincial Able Sail collaboration called Able Sail Ontario. The clubs represented in this collaboration, along with Ontario Sailing, will share resources, information and promote events with the goal of increasing the number of sailors with disabilities in Ontario. In addition, the Ontario Sailing Able Sail Committee was established to help with able sail initiatives across the province.

Access BOOM

The Access BOOM mobile is a traveling sailing school that journeys to different communities with two CYA Certified instructors, four accessible sailboats, a coach boat, and teaching aids to teach sailing to people with disabilities. The specially designed Access Dinghy makes it possible for people with a variety of disabilities to sail independently. The Access BOOM program was created in 2000 to give youth with disabilities a new recreational activity to enjoy in the summer; however, we do have some adult participants in this program as well. In 2008, approximately 70 participants experienced the thrill of sailing through this program. We ran seven weeks of the program and one week of evening classes.

Special thanks go out to the instructors who taught a fantastic Access BOOM Program this summer.

Able Sail Demonstration

The purpose of this mobile is to increase both club and individual awareness of sailing opportunities for people with disabilities. In 2008 we promoted sailing opportunities for people with disabilities through Boat Shows, our Annual Training Workshop, and Club Open Houses. We also ran an Able Sail Demonstration weekend at Sail Parry sound where many participants sailed for the first time.

Program Development

Ontario Sailing works with volunteers from various clubs across Ontario to help them start and run sailing programs for people with disabilities. Over the course of the last few years we have helped clubs and schools develop accessible sailing programs that meet the needs of their specific club.

Ontario Sailing continued this work with volunteers and clubs across the province and country to develop accessible sailing opportunities for youth and adults.

This year our ACCESS BOOM program travel to two communities in Nova Scotia -- Guysborough and Mabou -- to run the program. We were able to give approximately 20 people the opportunity to experience sailing.

ABLE SAIL REPORT (cont'd)

Boat Loan/Lease Program

Ontario Sailing owns several accessible sailboats that we loan/lease to clubs and sailing schools that want to provide sailing opportunities for people with disabilities. Our Boat Loan/Lease Program is an important part of Program Development. Loaning or leasing boats from Ontario Sailing allows clubs to open their doors to people with disabilities, with minimal resources. This season Ontario Sailing loaned out one Martin 16 and two Access Dinghies to two different sites.

Competitive Sailing

This year Ontario Sailing changed our athlete development model and named 2 Ontario Paralympic Training centres -- Nepean Sailing Club and Royal Hamilton Yacht Club. Both centres have increased the training opportunities and the opportunities for their athletes to work with high level coaching which resulted in some outstanding results at regattas.

Training camps for different classes were held at CORK and at Nepean where the athletes and coaches were able to learn and to train with the Ontario Sailing High Performance Coordinator as well as other coaches and athletes.

This year four athletes received Quest for Gold Funding, were provincially carded and made the Ontario Sailing Quest for Gold Elite Team. Congratulations to Audrey Kobayashi (SKUD), Rick Watters (SKUD), Nigist Sewnnet, (2.4mR) and Aaron Wong-Sing (2.4mR).

It was a great year for athletes with a disability in Ontario and we hope that in 2009 we are able to build on our accomplishments from 2008.

Partnerships

In 2008, Ontario Sailing developed a partnership with the Ontario Track 3 Association to help promote each other's sports and volunteer opportunities.

The Ontario Track 3 Ski Association is a volunteer non-profit organization that teaches children and youth with disabilities to downhill ski and snowboard. They are always in need of new ski and snowboard instructors as well as support volunteers. For more information log on to www.track3.org

With this partnership we hope to attract more participants and dedicated volunteers to the world of sailing and of skiing.

LEARN TO CRUISE/POWER COMMITTEE REPORT

In 2008 the committee continued to focus on upgrading our National Instructor training materials. Basic Cruising Instructor Clinic conductor and student guides were completed. Focus in the coming year will be on completing upgrades to instructor resource materials as well as to materials used to train Power Instructors. This has been a time consuming task and continues to take up significant effort from volunteers. We are appreciative of their ongoing effort and promise further materials in the New Year.

Ontario Learn To Cruise Instructors:

This year we once again experienced a reduction in the total number of instructors trained in the province, although the number of Basic Cruising Instructors remains stable. The number of new Cruising instructors drove the reduction in numbers on prior years with an unusually low number of instructors entering the system. It is critical that we maintain a constant flow of new instructors in order to build the pool and to ensure that we are accessing new ideas and new experiences through new people. A new CYA / Power Squadron agreement simplifying the process for CYA Instructors to become VHF Radio instructors is reflected in the 44 new Maritime Radio Instructors.

REGATTA COMMITTEE REPORT

From Irene McNeill, Committee Chair

The committee did not meet formally this year. The Notice of Series was published for the Ontario Sailing Title Events Series Championship incorporating recommendations and suggestions received during its inaugural year. The results of three of the four possible regattas were used to determine the Title Series winners in each of the age and boat categories. The age groups have been re-defined to Under 16, 17-18, 19-23 and over 23. The under 16 age group represents the novice racer. The 17-18 age group includes the intermediate racer and also those sailors who no longer race or participate in a sailing school program but are working. The 19-23 age group includes the collegiate sailor. It is hoped that by aligning the age groups as such, more sailors will continue with their racing programs on weekends by competing in 3 of 4 regattas during the summer. It is hoped that increased participation by these sailors in these age groups, which historically decrease at this time point, will occur.

New this year, was the addition of a Title Events Series for the Optimist Dinghy Class with the Notice of Series developed and posted on the Ontario Sailing website.

The on-line post-regatta survey was available on the website for competitors to complete. While not widely used, it does provide an opportunity for sailors to voice their praise or concerns about any of the Title Series regattas. It is suggested that this forum be maintained with its availability advertised by Ontario Sailing and regatta organizers for the up coming 2009 sailing season. The committee continues to endorse the on-line regatta registration system.

Recommendations for next year would include identifying a volunteer to coordinate the Title Series Regattas (5 in total including the High School Regatta) on behalf of Ontario Sailing. Their responsibilities would include:

- determining which clubs would be assigned a Title Series regatta
- establishing the dates for each regatta
- negotiating and having a memorandum of agreement signed with Ontario Sailing
- provide support for the regatta organizer, ensuring a quality event

It is recommended that a formal Title Events Series Championship be planned for the Collegiate (ages 19-23) sailor and those over 23 years of age for 2009. In addition, the group representing Collegiate sailors has requested that Ontario Sailing assist with the Canadian Collegiate Championship. It is recommended that this be encouraged.

The Regatta Committee has discussed but made no decisions regarding the continuation of the Ontario Women's Dinghy Championship. In the past it has simply been an add-on to an existing regatta. Since both males and females compete together in all fleets, and the top sailor could be either a male or a female depending on the regatta, the awarding of prizes to the top 3 males and the top 3 females in each fleet was discontinued a number of years ago. It seems as though this event has run its course. The only consideration that should be made in terms of continuing this event is if Ontario Sailing receives funding or additional funding for a Women's Championship.

Lastly, 2009 is the year for the Canada Summer Games. Ontario Sailing was required to run test events this year and qualifying events for next year. A "Technical Committee" has been suggested to oversee the four events to ensure consistency. Royal Hamilton Yacht Club (Lilac) and Toronto Sailing and Canoe Club (Icebreakers) have been asked to host the test events this year and the qualifiers next year.
