PRESIDENT AND EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

From Donna Scott, President and Glenn Lethbridge, Executive Director

This has been an outstanding year for Ontario Sailing! Even though we are technically reporting on the financial year ending March 31st 2009, this report will highlight much of the work done in the spring, summer and fall of 2009.

Volunteers-you are Ontario Sailing:

The age old question remains "who is Ontario Sailing and what do they do for us"? The answers to this question can be found in hundreds of pages of notes, emails, website stories and many conversations over a cold beer or pop. The real answer lies in the work of our volunteer Race Officials, Board Members, Committee Members, Regatta Supporters, Club Members, Coaches (both paid and volunteer), Instructors (both paid and volunteer) and the list goes on.

There would not be any races, regattas, training courses, clubs, events, and websites or for that matter a strong Provincial Sport Organization in Ontario without volunteers. We tend to take things for granted when it comes to a perfect start line, Race Official training, development of standards for Learn to Sail/Cruise/Windsurf/Powerboat, support documents for running a school, club, committee or event. When it all comes down to it, those instrumental in the formation of the Ontario Sailing Association in 1970 saw the vision to support all sailors for years to come.

2010 and Beyond

The downturn in the economy told every business including the not for profit sectors that only the strong will survive. Ontario Sailing, its Board of Directors and staff during our Base Funding submission to the Ministry Health Promotions had to create a new strategic plan, operational plan and overall vision for our next three years.

As a million dollar operation we need to be financially strong and forward thinking while at the same time serving our member clubs, membership, coaches, officials, athletes and all our volunteers.

The following five core priorities were developed, supported and voted on by the Board and then presented to the Ministry as our plan looking forward:

1. Financial Stability/Increase Financial Reserves
2. LTAD Integration
3. CBET/New NCCP Coach Program Implementation
4. Year 3 Support of Training Centres program and the Development of a National Training Centre in Toronto
5. Enhance Communications with Members-Sponsors-Donors

With the strong financial support of the Ministry Health Promotions, and the reporting of over 100,000 members in Ontario, we received an increase of 18% in our base funding for the FY 2009/10. This support has helped Ontario Sailing start to create a stronger financial position moving forward. With this support, each of the core priorities set by the Board will be realized.

FUNDRAISING and BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT REPORT

One of the great things about sailors is their ability to give back to the community that has been so good to them! It's that generosity, both individual and corporate, that helps our sport to grow and prosper right from the grassroots level to the Olympians and offshore ocean sailors.

The Fundraising/Business Development Committee's goal is to raise funds through corporate sponsorships, individual donations and targeted fundraising events. We do this both by ensuring that our corporate partners receive excellent value for their sponsorship dollars and by ensuring that our guests have FUN at our FUNdraising events.

Some of our corporate sponsorship support is received in the form of monetary support, some in the form of gifts-in-kind, some in the form of services provided and some a combination of more than one of the above. We would like to extend a HUGE THANK YOU to all of our sponsors for 2009! Without you many of our programs would just not be possible. We had a wonderful time seeing many of you at the 4th Annual Sponsor Luncheon in November and we look forward to working with you in 2010 to maximize the return you receive from your investment in Ontario Sailing. Our sponsors are listed on the Ontario Sailing website. We encourage our members to support the sponsors that support us.

To date, the 2009 Individual Donor Campaign is way ahead of the 2008 Campaign in part because of one large, almost \$24,000 donation. We have had a total of 22 donors and have raised just over \$30,440. Thank you to all our continued supporters and those who have decided to support Ontario Sailing financially for the first time!

We are extremely pleased and grateful that the Ontario Sailing Able Sail program was selected for the 10th year in a row as one of the organizations to benefit from the NMMA's Boating for Children's Charity event. This event was held at the Toronto International Boat Show on January 9, 2009. Unfortunately, this event has been cancelled for 2010 and will be re-evaluated for 2011.

Fundraising events are also FUNraising events and the 7th Annual *Celebration of Sailing* FUNraising dinner was a great success on both levels. The evening occurred on February 28, 2009 and was held at The Boulevard Club for the second time. We raised our highest amount to date at just under \$23,000 and the 153 guests attending had a great night. The 8th Annual *Celebration of Sailing – The Ruby Gala*, in honour of our 40th year, will take place on March 27, 2010 and will again be at The Boulevard Club in Toronto. Tickets are on sale now and are selling quickly thanks to the extraordinary efforts of the Gala Committee.

We are adding two new FUNdraising events in 2010 – the First Annual Fogh Marine Ontario Sailing Ski Day taking place at Craigeith on February 19, 2010. Tickets for this event and for the raffle where Fogh Marine has generously donated a laser as the grand prize are selling fast and furiously.

The second new event planned for 2010 is a fall, Hans Fogh Ontario Sailing Endowment Fund Golf Tournament. Full details will be announced on the Ontario Sailing website and in the Ontario Sailing e-newsletter later in the year.

We continue to benefit from the sales of Regatta Wine. Our wristbands and the Olympic Legacy Book will also raise our visibility while raising funds to help with all of our programming.

In November we had a unique opportunity to participate in an event put on by the Hamilton Port Authority and St. Lawrence Seaway at the IMAX Niagara Falls theatre – again a great opportunity to raise the profile of Ontario Sailing in the community as well as we raised \$1800. Many thanks to the Hamilton Port Authority and St. Lawrence Seaway for including us as beneficiaries of their event.

Thank you everyone who has supported us this year. We are looking forward with great optimism to 2010!

TREASURER'S REPORT

From Christine Winiarz Searle, CMA, Treasurer

Ontario Sailing continued to strengthen its financial position during the fiscal year ended March 31, 2009. Prudent fiscal management resulted in a surplus of \$23,968 – an increase of 80% from the prior year's surplus of \$13,274. In 2008-09, revenues increased by 8% to \$991K, while expenses increased by only 7% to \$967K.

The Association's operating results are healthy, and Ontario Sailing's financial position as of March 31, 2009 is also impressive. Current assets (including cash and short-term investments) at the beginning of April 2009 were \$356.6K, an increase of about 67% (\$142.7K) from April 1, 2008. Improvements in liquidity – an increase of \$120.6K in cash and short-term investments and careful management of receivables, payables and deferred revenue, have improved the Association's capacity to adapt to unexpected events and periods of tight cash flow.

To effectively deliver its programs, Ontario Sailing invested \$16.9K in capital assets (i.e. boats, computer equipment) in 2008-09, and net assets increased to \$136.6K from \$112.7K at the end of March 2008. As at March 31, 2009, unrestricted operating reserves were about 67.8% of net assets (\$92.6K), an increase of about 77% (nearly \$40K) from \$51.6K in operating reserves as at March 31, 2008. Finally, Ontario Sailing again received a clean audit opinion on the information presented in the financial statements prepared by management and staff, as presented in this Annual Report.

The positive financial performance for 2008-09 set the stage for a five-year program of financial stability beginning 2009-10. In April 2009, the Board of Directors approved the following financial priorities:

1. Investigate new revenue growth outside of traditional government funding, including new user fees, increased membership, and new sponsors;
2. Run a second fundraising event (in addition to Celebration of Sail); and
Increase reserves by 5% of budget annually to \$200K in reserves by 2013-2014.

APPEALS COMMITTEE REPORT

The Ontario Sailing Appeals Committee's job is to answer appeals submitted by competitors who have been party to a protest hearing and are unsatisfied with the decision of the Protest Committee. Appeals can only be submitted by parties to the protest hearing and usually claim there was an incorrect rule interpretation or conclusion, or a procedural mistake by the Protest Committee. Some appeals attempt to appeal the facts found which, according to *The Racing Rules of Sailing*, may not be appealed. The Appeals Committee also responds to requests from protest committees for confirmation or correction of its decision when it is uncertain it came to the correct decision.

In 2009 the Appeals Committee dealt with nine appeals, up from five in 2008. Some of them arrived very late and are still in progress as I write this report and one appeal has been further appealed to the CYA Appeals Committee. In one other case we published our decision but felt that the rules question was interesting enough that we referred it to the CYA Appeals Committee for confirmation. We have not heard back yet in either case.

This year, three of the appeals involved protests where a member of our committee was a member of the original protest committee. *The Racing Rules of Sailing* prohibits the involvement of such a member in any appeal. We continue to keep the numbers and depth on the committee to handle the appeal without the involvement of any particular member.

We continued our practice from previous years of handling as much of the appeal process as possible electronically. To make sure that the parties receive the final decision, a hardcopy is sent via regular mail as well. Appeals took longer to handle this year than we would have liked and we will look at our processes to see if this can be improved next year.

This year is the fourth year that I have been chair of the committee and it is time for me to pass on the chair. It has been a pleasure to serve and I want to thank Ontario Sailing for giving me the opportunity.

As I write this my successor has not been announced but I have full confidence that the committee will be in good hands.

I want to take this opportunity to thank the rest of the current members of the committee and the others who have served during the four years for their tremendous contributions. Appeals are not handled by a single person. There has always been good discussion about the decisions and several members have done a great job writing and editing our decisions. In this context I particularly want to thank Kathy Dyer who probably wrote more decisions than most of the rest of the committee combined. Over the next year there will probably be a few other changes in the committee as we try to bring on new members.

I want to take this opportunity to thank Shauna Carlidge in the Ontario Sailing office for all of the support that she has given me over the past four years. I never had any troubles with delays in the Ontario Sailing office. Sometimes she had things processed before I even had a chance to see them. Any delays we had did not come from her.

We have an excellent group of experienced judges on the Ontario Sailing Appeals Committee and great Ontario Sailing staff and I thank them all on your behalf. The members of the committee are:

2009 saw a drop in the BOOM participation. We started off with great registration; however, before the program got off the ground we had many cancellations, some due to the economic times but 3 of them were because of the development of new sustainable sailing schools at former host sites. Keeping this in mind the program still trained approximately 625 participants at a total of 23 sites. We ran 31 weeks of programming out of a possible 40 with 8 instructors and one head instructor.

ABLE SAIL REPORT

Ontario Sailing has several initiatives to increase the level of accessible sailing in Ontario. Through our programs, and use of special equipment, people of all ages and with all types of disabilities can experience the sport of sailing.

These initiatives include:

Able Sail Ontario – a provincial collaboration of clubs and programs

Access BOOM – a Mobile Sailing program for people with disabilities

Able Sail Demonstration – weekend and trade show demonstrations of accessible sailing

Program Development – resources to help develop more accessible sailing across Ontario

Boat Loan Program – boats available for loan for programs starting up

Paralympic Training Centres – funded training facilities / services for athlete and coach development

Highlights of 2009:

2009 was another successful year for the accessible sailing initiatives for Ontario Sailing. Our Access BOOM program had another great season traveling about 12,000 kilometres to deliver programming across Ontario to approximately 75 sailors with a disability. A special thanks goes to the Access BOOM instructors, Emma Millson-Taylor and Alex Wilson, for a fantastic summer.

A Paralympic Training Camp was held at Royal Hamilton Yacht Club, one of our designated Paralympic Training Centres, and it attracted many athletes in a variety of classes. This camp was a huge success for the development of athletes and coaches alike.

The partnership with Dell Pharmacy was an excellent addition to our programs for this year. With their financial support we were able to run a Paralympic Training Camp at one of our Paralympic Training Centres as well as cover some costs of the Access BOOM Program. We look forward to continuing this relationship well into the future.

Canada's annual Mobility Cup regatta was hosted in Ontario by one of our member clubs -- the Disabled Sailing Association of Ontario. This regatta attracted many sailors including internationals. As well, senior sailing officials and both the President and a Vice-President of the IFDS were present and active in their support. In addition, this is the first year that the Mobility cup hosted more than one class. It included not only the traditional Martin-16s but also the ISAF recognized Access Liberty class and the Paralympic class 2.4mR. Mobility Cup race results served to score the Access Class Association of Canada championship and the 2.4mR North Americans.

This year the Access BOOM and BOOM program were recognized by CYA with the William Abbott Senior – Sail Training Program of the Year -- Award. This award recognizes the dedication and passion of all the staff and volunteers who have had a hand in the program over the years. Thanks to all of those who have contributed to the program. This award is for you!

We look forward to another great year in 2010.

LEARN TO CRUISE/POWER COMMITTEE REPORT

From Jamie Gordon, Committee Chair & Eric Carlidge, Program Director

In 2009 the committee continued to focus on upgrading our National Instructor training materials. The Intermediate Cruising Instructor materials were updated and used in a clinic held in Ontario. Limited progress was made on updating Power Instructor training materials.

Ontario Learn To Cruise Instructors

The overall number of instructors in the province remained stable in 2009. The total number of instructors trained in the province rebounded from the dip experienced last year. The majority of this training was conducted at two clinics. A single large clinic (16 candidates) was held in challenging weather in the spring in Toronto, and a smaller clinic (8 candidates) was held in Ottawa later in the spring. Clinic outcomes for candidates are complete, incomplete or unsuccessful. Four of the candidates were unsuccessful and are not reflected in the instructor training numbers shown. Incomplete candidates are responsible for completing outstanding items and communicating their progress to Ontario Sailing. Once complete they are eligible to register with the CYA, pay annual CYA instructor fees and to certify students. Available CYA records show that only 5 of the 26 instructor candidates completed the registration process and paid annual fees.

ATHLETE DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE REPORT

The 2009 season was a great success for Ontario Sailing.

There was a continued effort to improve coaching and training opportunities through the Development, Paralympic and Regional Centres. These efforts helped to improve Ontario sailors and coaches contributing to the successes noted below. This system is targeted at developing successful athletes and coaches at all levels of athlete and coach development.

Additionally, 2009 saw the initiation of a new partnership with the Canadian Sport Centre Ontario (CSCO) as they have included sailing as one of their targeted sports for Olympic success. This has provided our Quest for Gold athletes access to fitness testing, athletic assessment and injury prevention provided by the physiologists and athletic therapists at CSCO.

As part of our new partnership, along with CYA, additional funds have been provided to provide full time coaching as part of a National Sailing Sport Centre Ontario, located at RCYC and at the Miami sailing centre in Florida during the winter months. After a rigorous search and interview process, former Olympian Chris Cook was selected as one of the Centre's coaches along with Dan Cunningham. This initiative would not have been possible without all the dedicated partners - CYA, Ontario Sailing, CSCO and RCYC.

Quest For Gold Funding

In 2009 12 athletes (8 able bodied and 4 Paralympic) received Quest For Gold funding in the amount of \$7,300 each for a total of \$87,600 in funding.

New CORK Format

Congratulations to CORK Sail Kingston on successfully launching a new International Regatta and Olympic Classes Regatta. This new opportunity provided high quality racing to almost 600 sailors from 15 nations.

Laser World Championships

The 2009 Laser World Championships were held at the St. Margaret's Bay Yacht Club. Canada boasted the largest team with over 15 athletes. Many athletes represented Ontario including David Wright (6th), Lee Parkhill (16th), Bernard Luttmer (30th), Chris Dold (35th), Evan Lewis (72nd), Robert Davis (87th), Greg Clunies (135th) and Paul Brikis (141st).
